Summer Picnic Included Food, Fun and Games

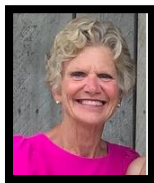

Welcome September!

Ah, September- the start of cooler weather, high school football, and a brand-new year for the Tri Lakes Women's Club. Do you realize this will be the fiftieth anniversary of when TLWC, formerly known as the Woodmoor Wives' Club, sponsored their first "fundraiser" in 1972? They sold kitchen sponges and dip mixes and held a Christmas Boutique and Bake Sale. Home tours were also offered at \$2.50. The money raised went to two scholarships and the Volunteer Fire Department. Sixty-five members each paid \$1.00 in annual dues.

We've come a long way in fifty years. We currently have two hundred and sixteen members who pay \$50.00 in annual dues. We have twenty-four groups that cater to the interests of our members and have provided over a million dollars in grants to many non-profit organizations in our community. Along with the grant money, TLWC provides monthly luncheons for the working homeless, participates in our Kiwanis partner's Empty Bowl fundraiser, and runs twice yearly food drives for Tri-Lakes Cares, among many other charitable endeavors. Plus, the second annual Holiday Home Tour is currently being planned for November.

None of this progress could have happened without the dedication and service of the many women who have served on the Board, who have stepped up to chair committees, and who have volunteered to work as committee members. "Teamwork Makes The Dream Work".

This dream or mission is one aspect of TLWC that has not changed over the last fifty years. The mission is and has always been to support the Tri-Lakes community through charitable and educational endeavors. TLWC raises and distributes funds to assist qualified non-profit organizations and promotes the education of its members and the community through instructional programs.

A huge "thank you" to all the women who have contributed to the longevity and success of Tri-Lakes Women's Club!

Our 2022 Grant Program Provided Imaging Cameras for Three District Ambulances

Several of our Board and Grant Committee members had an opportunity to meet with Lt. John Bodinsky of the Monument Fire Protection District (FPD) (formerly Tri-Lakes Monument FPD and the Donald Wescott FPD) to see the three thermal imaging cameras that a TLWC grant has provided for the district's three ambulances.

"These thermal imaging cameras", according to Lt. Bodinsky "will help increase overall life safety for our citizens and firefighters." At the time of their grant application, the Tri-Lakes Monument Fire Protection District had only three thermal imaging cameras with each one placed on one of three fire apparatus. Lt. Bodinsky further explained, "Our ambulances had no cameras, putting them at a disadvantage when responding to fire-related calls. The personnel on our ambulances are both firefighters and EMTs and are expected to respond to a multitude of different calls (including fire and possible rescue). These thermal imaging cameras will provide those firefighters an extra advantage when searching for fire victims, identifying hazards, and assisting them if they need help exiting structures when conditions are poor."
